WELLSFIELD TROUT FISHERY CATCH & RELEASE RULES

When your Fish Limit is reached you MUST weigh in your fish, then get your permit marked by staff before commencing Catch & Release.

All anglers should report number of fish caught and released to staff before leaving the fishery. C&R is available on both Fly Ponds only.

To Minimise STRESS and WOUNDING of FISH:

- 1) Barbless Hooks or De-Barbed Flies MUST be used.
- 2) Anybody caught using barbed hooks will be asked to leave the fishery.
- 3) Single hooks only, no trebles or doubles or tandem/trailing hooks.
- 4) Fish should be unhooked as quickly as possible.
- 5) All anglers MUST possess Forceps or Pliers for De-Barbing flies.
- 6) No Forceps = No C&R.
- 7) No Handling of Fish. Forceps should be used to remove hooks.
- 8) All anglers MUST wet their hands before unhooking fish with forceps.
- 9) All fish should be played as quickly as possible. Min. 6lb breaking strain should be used.
- 10) Fish should remain in water at all times when un-hooking, and be un-hooked in a wet net, or unhooked in the water.
- 11) Knotless nets should be used to avoid fish being damaged.
- 12) No dragging of fish up the bank or tailing of fish.
- 13) No weighing, measuring or photographs of fish out of water.
- 14) Any deep hooked fish in throat, gut or gills hook must be left in fish and line cut.
- 15) Fish should NEVER be held up vertically by the tail or held up vertically by the gills.
- 16) Bleeding or injured fish must be dispatched and paid for.
- 17) Any angler who breaches these rules will be asked to leave the fishery without refund.

Caution: When water temperatures exceed 17-18°C take extra care as oxygen levels will be lower and fish will get stressed much more easily.
