Wellsfield Trout Fishery has 3 lochans, set in a 30 acre site.

- **Lochan Hearadh** (the top lochan)
This fly-only lochan is 5 acres in size and up to 19ft deep with 45 bank fishing pegs. Hearadh is pronounced “hairrock” and is Norse meaning “high land”. Its English translation is “Harris”.
- **Lochan Uaithne** (the middle lochan)
This fly only lochan is 4 acres in size and up to 18ft deep with 20 bank fishing pegs. Uaithne is pronounced “aitney” is Irish Gaelic. In Irish mythology, Uaithne is the harpist who plays the magical harp of The Dagda, an important god of the Tuatha Dé Danann race of people in Irish mythology. The harps music put a spell on their enemies when going into battle. Its English translation is “Anthony”.
- **Lochan Fionn** (the bottom lochan)
This lochan is an any method lochan (bait, spinning, fly) and is 3 acres in size and up to 20 feet deep with 25 bank fishing pegs. Fionn is Scots Gaelic meaning “fair”. Fionn is the same mythical person as Fingal the Giant. In Scots mythology, Fionn was the leader of The Fianna, a group of tribal warriors who fought the Norse people from taking Scotland. Fionn is also the father of Ossian.
